COVIDSafe App

The uptake of this app is extremely high on the Australian Government's agenda and as such we will continue including this section in our Incident Controller messages as a daily reminder to download and keep the app on. Note this can be on your private device as well as your Queensland Health device, should you have one. It's extremely user friendly and easy to download and as I said yesterday, we strongly encourage you to do so as soon as you are able.

Pine Rivers Respiratory Assessment Clinic

As mentioned yesterday, our respiratory assessment clinic at Pine Rivers will be closed on Monday 4 May for the Labour Day Public Holiday. The nearest fever clinic that will be open is Redcliffe Hospital. Pine Rivers RAC will reopen on Tuesday 5 May at 8am.

There is still the ability to contact individuals in the MN EOC with the Incident Controller, Duty Manager and Communications still available on call if required.
