Current situation

We currently have 821 active cases of COVID in our care, including 194 inpatients with 7 ventilated in ICU.

There are also 621 staff away from work due to either being COVID positive or requiring isolation due to being a close contact.

Visitor exemptions

Changes to the <u>Management of Diagnosed Cases of COVID-19 and Close Contacts Direction</u> (<u>No. 3</u>) allows hospital operators to approve exemptions for visitors who are diagnosed with COVID or who are close contacts.

In exceptional and compassionate circumstances, such as an end-of-life visit or visiting a patient who is seriously or critically ill, the hospital operator can consider an exemption at any stage of the 14-day isolation period.

For most other situations, we can consider an exemption for a visitor who is not symptomatic and is at Day 8 or later.

The visitor exemption form has been updated to allow local EOC approval.

Anyone else with symptoms who does not have an exemption is still asked not to visit.
