Hi and welcome to my message this week.

For those of you who don't know me, I'm Jane Hancock and I'm the Chief Operating Officer for Metro North Health.

And before I start today's message, can I acknowledge the traditional owners, custodians and claimants at the land on which we meet, work and deliver our health services.

And can I pay my respects to elders past and present.

So behind me is the new Caboolture Satellite Hospital and together with this message is a walkthrough video of the new satellite hospital that I would encourage you to have a look at.

This is a really exciting initiative and Caboolture Satellite Hospital is due to open on or early August, so we're in full flight getting ready for that facility to be opened.

So we have three satellite hospitals within Metro North, one at Caboolture, one at Kallangur which will open later this year, and then Bribie Island, which will open early next year, and the satellite hospitals are part of a Queensland Government investment of \$376.9 million.

So the Caboolture satellite hospital is conveniently located near the train station and it is located on Rowe St. So there will be a mix of new and existing services offered at the Caboolture Satellite Hospital, including the Minor Injury and Illness Clinic with medical imaging services.

Now, that clinic will see adults and children over three months of age who require care for non-life-threatening conditions, such as sprains, strains, tooth and earache, minor head injuries without loss of consciousness, allergies, infections and the like.

The minor injury and illness clinics will be walk-in urgent care services and we are working closely with QAS to take non-life-threatening ambulance arrivals are there as well which is great and will support the work of our emergency physicians and our emergency department.

The clinics will be staffed by doctors, nurse practitioners, clinical nurses and allied health practitioners.

There will also be medical imaging staff on site.

As I previously mentioned, also within the mix of services are eight dental chairs for general and emergency adults and children's oral health services, and community adult mental health team will be there,

Adult persons mental health team and Ngarrama maternal health.

There will also be new outpatients sleep study service there and all of the Caboolture Satellite Hospital will be managed by Caboolture, Kilcoy, Woodford. The Kallangur Satellite Hospital will be managed as a satellite of The Prince Charles Hospital and Bribie Island Satellite Hospital will also be managed by Caboolture Kilcoy, Woodford Directorate.

So thank you for joining me for this message.
