We recently received the Key Performance Indicator (KPI) Report and it highlighted how well our Metro North team were doing caring for the elderly, especially in light of the huge demand they experience compared to the rest of the state.

The ACAT team is performing well above many health services across South East Queensland, and a large proportion of the state.

Regularly, I come across stories that highlight how the care we provide can positively inspire and change people's lives. We recieved a compliment from a father who expressed his gratitude for the care his son recieved, as well as the resulting renewed drive of his son toward his medical career.

While his son was preparing for his Year 12 UCAT 2024 test hoping to enter University of Queensland medicine in 2025 he became aware of Diabetes and noticed he had symptoms of Type 1 Diabetes.

He was later diagnosed and through his experience with COH and TPCH staff he is now determined to gain a place at university studying medicine next year but with a new focus on paediatric endocrinology.

His first action toward this goal has been his Year 12 Chemistry IA3 Research Assignment Topic being the "*Application of continuous glucose monitors based on biochemical oxidate pathways in the management of diabetes*".
