NAIDOC Week, which first began in 1975, provides an opportunity for all Australians to learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth.

This year's theme chosen by the National NAIDOC Committee, is 'Keep the Fire Burning! Blak, Loud & Proud':

"Blak, Loud, and Proud' encapsulates the unapologetic celebration of Indigenous identity, empowering us to stand tall in our heritage and assert our place in the modern world.

In recognition of the tireless contributions of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elders to our health service, the A&TSILT will host a special celebratory Elders luncheon on July 11 at North Lakes. This closed event aims to honour the significant impact of their knowledge, time, energy, and wisdom in enhancing the services we deliver to our community.
