The change reflects what many of us are seeing in the wider community, with modelling indicating we will be seeing even more flu, COVID, and respiratory illnesses toward the end of this month.

You may also have noticed some new signs around the campus (right) this week encouraging patients and visitors to wear masks - especially those who are immunocompromised.

Along with preventing the spread of respiratory infections, we are mindful that there are a lot of construction works at the hospital currently.

This request is in addition to the many measures that construction contractors and builders have in place to ensure public safety, including ongoing air quality monitoring and dust suppression.
