Health Equity targets for oral health exceeded

I just want to acknowldge some great work of the Metro North Oral Health Service and all of the dental health teams in the community supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Last financial year, we exceeded the target for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people by close to 7,000 occasions of service.

In total, 22,872 oral health care appointments were provided last year.
