Demolition activities commencing Monday

With the decant of West Block and Fincorp complete, demolition activities are ready to get underway.

Multiplex will commence demolition works for the West Block and Fincorp buildings on Monday (2 September). The demolition process will take several weeks and we can expect periods of noisy works.

There will be a number of controls in place to minimise noise, but as we have learnt over the past nine months, construction works involve noisy and disruptive activities.

I would also like to acknowledge that the demolition of these buildings will bring mixed emotions to staff and community. Please be mindful of these sensitivities, particularly given our recent formal acknowledgment that stolen wages were used to build the hospital, including West Block.

Unused for a day? Take It Away!

Redcliffe Hospital Infection Prevention and Control Clinical Nurse Consultant Paul Simpson has initiated a peripheral intravenous catheter (PIVC) care improvement campaign.

We are currently seeing an increase in PIVC-related bloodstream infections. To help address this, Paul is encouraging nursing and medical staff to assess and remove PIVCs as soon as they are no longer required, particularly if they have not been used for more than 24 hours.

This initiative is based on the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care (ACSQHC) Clinical Care Standard, which is *available online here*.

It's always important to risk assess every cannula, every shift!
