As part of the Redcliffe Hospital Expansion, we are set to welcome around 3000 new colleagues to our workforce in the coming years. This growth of our hospital reflects that of the region and community who rely on our services.

Since starting as ED earlier this year, I have had the opportunity to meet with the Mayor of the City of Moreton Bay and other council executives. Like us, they have a vested interest in the future success of the region and the hospital.

As part of getting ready for such a large recruitment program, we will be working closely with the council to integrate our planning and will take part in expos and other events to attract people to the region and hospital as great places to live and work. As it is likely many of our new colleagues will come from outside the region, the council will develop a specific healthcare worker welcome pack to help them as they settle into their new home and get to know the community.

The hospital expansion and growth of the region in the lead up to the 2032 Olympics is an exciting time and presents many opportunities. Along with other hospital executives and leaders, I'm looking forward to partnering with the City of Moreton Bay to ensure the future success of the region and our hospital. Hospital governance and structure review

As we prepare for the hospital's growth over the coming years, it's important we have appropriate governance structures in place to manage and oversee how we work. To help with this, we will be establishing a new Executive Leadership Team (ELT), which will operate alongside the current Senior Leadership Team (SLT). The SLT will be made up of the leads from the hospital and will focus on our operations. Whereas the ELT will take a strategic view of how we operate. There will be some overlap in membership between the two groups to ensure open communication between them.

The fundamentals of financial management

At this week's manager's forum, Director of Finance Akhil Kapoor presented to the group on the fundamentals of financial management. At differing levels, everybody has a role to play in financial management. From those who manage cost centres, to us all ensuring we're using resources efficiently and effectively. During the session, Akhil talked about activity-based funding, the important role that capturing accurate patient data plays in funding decisions, and the costs involved with particular patient flows as they pass through our care.
