As we move into the festive season, I just want to mention that we are also expecting a summer filled with severe weather including above average rainfall, more severe storms and heat waves.

With many of our staff out and about visiting patients in the home or community I ask that you ensure personal safety is a top priority.

With many expected heatwaves in the coming months where the maximum and minimum temperature are unusually high for three or more days - we will also see a lot of hot nights that contribute to making heatwaves dangerous.

Keep an eye out for messages and severe weather broadcasts sent via email and share these with staff who may not have email access.

Please be aware of the symptoms of <u>heat-related</u> <u>illness</u> and be familiar with the <u>Heatwave workplace</u> <u>quideline</u> for employees.

Some simple tips for staying safe include:

- Staying hydrated and packing extra water if you are on the road.
- · Trying to stay out of the sun
- Utilising the car air conditioning to stay cool
- Keeping your phone charged for emergencies
- And, remembering when it is flooded forget it.
