HelDI Annual Forum and Lipman Oration

The Herston Infectious Diseases Institute (HeIDI) hosted their 4th Annual Forum on Thursday 7 November at the RBWH Education Centre. This year's event featured sessions covering the themes of clinical trials, antimicrobial stewardship, healthcare acquired infection and digital innovation, diagnostics and prevention of vascular access related infections. The tone of the day was set by a wonderful reminder of why we do the things we do, with an opening presentation from a consumer about her experience in participating in a life-changing clinical trial. This was followed by presentations from local, national and international experts, including a Keynote presentation about the importance of randomised placebo controlled clinical trials during pandemics by Professor Andre Kalil from the University of Nebraska Medical Center in the US. There was also an update on the latest in diagnostics and clinical metagenomics from Professor Jonathan Edgeworth from Guys and St Thomas' Hospital in London.

The Forum was followed by the Lipman Oration last night, named in honour of one of RBWH's prominent researchers, Professor Jeffrey Lipman, with another presentation from Professor Andre Kalil about his personal journey as a clinician-researcher, which reminded those in attendance about the importance of being a curious and humble clinician. Today, HeIDI continues their educational offerings, with sessions on Smart Management of PIVCs and Clinical Metagenomics.

Occupational Violence Strategy Unit visit

Occupational Violence (OV) is one of the leading work-related incidents reported by Metro North staff, including here at RBWH. None of us should accept OV as 'part of the job', irrespective of the intent for harm.

It is estimated that 95 per cent of healthcare workers have experienced OV during their career. Types of OV may include physical assault, verbal abuse or harassment, intimidation, threatening behaviour, sexual abuse or harassment or abuse through technology.

Staff profile: Fire Safety Advisors Kalem and Jordan Brown

Kalem recently joined his brother Jordan Brown in the role of RBWH Fire Safety Advisor. Their job is to help staff understand fire safety and the procedures to follow in emergencies.

A big part of that is the implementation of fire training across the service, something Jordan says is of critical importance.

"Firstly, it's the law. Fire training is mandatory.

"But it's something you can do not just for yourself, but everyone around you – your colleagues, patients and their loved ones who are visiting – it affects their safety too."

Kalem and Jordan say they enjoy helping staff and wardens understand fire safety requirements, and what action to take when fire or smoke is discovered to ensure people can evacuate buildings safely and quickly in a fire or hazardous materials emergency.



Kalem and Jordan came into their current roles from a security background, with both saying they've been interested in fire safety since they were kids.

The Fire Safety Team says: "We encourage all staff to keep up to date with their mandatory fire and evacuation training.

"It's easy to push training to the side when we work in a fast-paced environments, but it's quick and easy to do."
