This engagement was the next step in our ongoing commitment to ensuring the voices of our First Nations community are heard as part of decision making around the future Redcliffe Hospital.

## **Occupational Violence Roadshow**

Occupational Violence (OV) is one of the leading work-related incidents reported by Metro North staff, including here at Redcliffe Hospital. None of us should accept OV as 'part of the job', irrespective of the intent for harm.

It is estimated that 95 per cent of healthcare workers have experienced OV during their career. Types of OV may include physical assault, verbal abuse or harassment, intimidation, threatening behaviour, sexual abuse or harassment or abuse through technology.

To learn more about how to prevent and manage instances of OV, the Queensland Occupational Violence Strategy Unit will be visiting Redcliffe on Monday 25 November. This is your opportunity to talk with the team and hear how they can work with you to help prevent OV.
