Emerging Leader Profile-Laura Smith

Post-intensive care syndrome (PICS). It's a constellation of physical, cognitive and mental health symptoms that can affect patients after an ICU stay, regardless of reason for admission or length of stay.

While ICU follow-up is well established overseas, Redcliffe Hospital's post-ICU follow-up clinic is the only permanently funded service of its kind in Australia.

This week's emerging leader, Clinical Nurse Consultant Laura Smith, is one of the team running our clinic.

In her role, Laura contacts patients a few months post-ICU stay to check-in on them. Where she identifies they need support, she refers them to the follow-up clinic to be seen by the consultant and clinical nurse. At the weekly multidisciplinary case conference, patient's cases are discussed with the allied health team, and referrals are put in place to support patient recovery.

In addition to this work, Laura also maintains a hand in clinical practice in ICU. She loves this combination of providing both clinical and post-stay care.



Laura enjoys being able to look after patients and describes the post-ICU service as the missing piece of the ICU services we currently provide. Her goal with this work is to help patients return to living a meaningful life – whatever that means for their lifestyle and circumstances.

As the only ICU follow-up clinic in Queensland, our clinic has recently started working with post-ICU patients from Caboolture Hospital and RBWH with a view to create a centralised service for all Metro North Health ICU patients.

Away from ICU, Laura is a sessional teacher of Nursing at the University of the Sunshine Coast at Petrie, where she is educating and inspiring a new generation of clinicians.

In her rare moments of downtime, you can find Laura reading or relaxing with her family and fur babies.

We should all be proud that Redcliffe Hospital is pioneering post-ICU care in Australia. Thanks to the team for the great work that you do as this complex area continues to evolve.

Unacceptable behaviour - discharge from care

It is estimated that 95 per cent of healthcare workers have experienced Occupational Violence during their career. Types of OV may include physical assault, verbal abuse or harassment, intimidation, threatening behaviour, sexual abuse or harassment or abuse through technology.

Metro North has an Unacceptable Behaviour – Discharge from Care Procedure that provides a framework to discharge patients from care where there is an immediate risk of harm.

Senior clinicians will have the support of the organisation to discharge a patient from care where an imminent risk to staff safety exists, no life-saving treatment is required, and the patient has capacity.
