It has been yet another significant year for the directorate, with an exceptionally long list of achievements and milestones delivered by you, our amazing staff and teams.

While there are too many to list today, I will mention a few of the highlights from 2024. This year, we have seen the:

- · First medical interns join COH.
- First medical students from Bond university join COH.
- First ever Metro North Dementia Choir and concert.
- Establishment of the New Brighton GEM service.
- Establishment of a new cinema and resident kitchen at Gannet House.
- Establishment of the Aboriginal Torres Strait Islander Nurse Navigator Service.
- Establishment of the new Brisbane City Nurse-Led Walk-in Clinic.
- Permanent establishment of the QAS Falls Co-Response Program.
- Continued enhancement of new dental clinics at the Satellite Hospitals.
- Introduction of the 90-plus oral health program where the elderly are seen in six-month recalls.
- · Residents at Cooinda House receive oral health screening.
- Brighton Wellness Hub reaching more than 650 attendees per month.
- Expansion of fifth year student clinical placements to Caboolture Outreach Dental Clinic and clinical practice at Woodford Correctional Centre and Kilcoy Dental Clinic.
- · Oral Health School Dental Service visiting Koobara Kindy.
- Increased success of the Rapid Access to Community Care service.
- Volunteers supporting Brighton Health Campus bedded services, Gannet House, Cooinda House, Zillmere RTCP and BBIS providing an average of 420 hours of unpaid work per month.

This is so much more than a list of highlights. This represents improved access for the people we care for as well as our commitment to grow the workforce of the future.

I cannot be prouder of all that you do and more, and importantly, I am proud of your generosity of spirit in the way you approach the continued growth and improvement of COH services.

One year on - Kallangur Dental Clinic and HAART

Continuing the theme of reaching milestones, the Kallangur Satellite Hospital celebrated its first year of operation yesterday.

For us, this is a very important milestone as we have two services co-located at the Satellite Hospital including the Healthy Ageing Assessment and Rehabilitation Team (HAART) and the Kallangur Dental Clinic.

The first year anniversary included a Smoking Ceremony to inspire and enhance the positive energy, as well as a barbeque and the opportunity for staff to pause and reflect on an important year.

For the Kallangur Dental Clinic, the staff have expanded to cater for special needs clients in the region, as well as caring for more than 2,100 adult patients in that period.



Interestingly enough, the dental teams have delivered close to 5,500 appointments which has included around 16,000 general or specialist dental treatments.

In it's first year, the Healthy Ageing Assessment and Rehabilitation Team (HAART) has helped around 500 elderly patients get their life back on track, and this has included more than 7,000 personalised appointments.

In the past quarter, we have seen a rapid rise in referrals, with the average age of our patients being 78 years old.

The majority of these referrals are through the Rapid Occupational Service which we offer via the Minor Injury and Illness Clinic.

Both services are doing exceptionally well, and I can't commend them enough. I also commend the Kallangur Satellite Hospital teams more broadly for working collaboratively across services.
