

Hi CKW team,

Our ieMR Project colleagues have confirmed they will be building our downtime kits over the Christmas and New Years' period. These kits will have everything you need in the event of a system downtime – including paper forms and printed quick reference guides (QRGs) – once we have gone live with the ieMR.

Delivery of the finalised kits to all clinical areas of Caboolture and Kilcoy Hospitals will occur from February onwards, with accompanying in-service sessions explaining what's in the kits. This will give everyone plenty of time to familiarise themselves with the ieMR downtime kits before go-live in May.

We are currently working with the ieMR Project team to ensure everything that needs to be in the kits is included. If you're a NUM/MUM or service line lead, keep an eye out for an email coming soon with details of what will be in your area's ieMR downtime kit, as well as a request to provide feedback on anything else you think should be included.

Nearly half of all prerequisite online training complete


We're nearly at the halfway mark for prerequisite online training completion, with 49 percent of all staff having completed their assigned prerequisite training.


Congratulations to everyone who has contributed to us (almost) reaching this halfway milestone!

For those who haven't yet had the opportunity, prerequisite online training is self-directed and available to complete via <u>Talent Management System (TMS)</u>. Prerequisite training must be completed prior to attending instructor-led training in the new year.
