- create documents that can be read by people with low-vision

- use <u>common accessibility symbols</u> in your communication so people know what options are available.

Metro North Spinal Injuries business case update

Last week we met with the Systems Planning Branch (SPB) regarding the spinal injuries business case. SPB are currently developing an implementation for future spinal cord injury services for Horizon 1 (next 12-18 months). This will outline the initiatives and costings for the short-term delivery of the SCI service model which will be implemented through a phased approach. Horizon 1 will take into consideration the proposed STARS and Townsville spinal services. The implementation plan/costings will go up to the Director-General before Christmas.

STARS Pre-Higher Degree by Research (HDR) Grants Program

The STARS Research Committee are pleased to announce a new support initiative for STARS clinicians: the **STARS Pre-HDR Grants Program**. The program is a competitive funding program that provides support for STARS staff to further develop their research plan, methodology and supervision plans, with the goal of achieving HDR enrolment in the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) or Master of Philosophy (MPhil) by 31st December 2025.

Funding will be available in the first round (1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025), with an indicative individual award of \$5,000 to \$10,000. Applications are encouraged from all professions (nursing, medical, and allied health) and are due **5pm Sunday 15 December 2024**.

The Research Committee anticipates a second round of funding in the next financial year for both the HDR and the pre-HDR schemes with applications opening around March 2025, with outcomes known by end June 2025.
