In July, our hospital transitioned to ieMR and became fully digital! This was a massive achievement and one that set a high benchmark for the ieMR roll-out across other Metro North locations. In the months since, we have worked to embed ieMR into our core business and have become more proficient in harnessing its capabilities to improve patient care and make things simpler for staff.

Another significant event this year was in May when we became the first Metro North hospital to acknowledge the wages stolen from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people that were used to build the hospital. I was honoured to attend the ceremony with local Elders and community members, where we unveiled a plaque that acknowledges the stolen wages. That plaque is now located near the entrance to the main building. Since this event, we have continued to engage with community as we work toward achieving healthy equity and progressing the hospital expansion.

Thank you to everyone for making me feel so welcome since I started as Executive Director earlier this year. I'm proud to be part of a team that works tirelessly each day to achieve positive outcomes for patients and is committed to ensuring Redcliffe Hospital remains a great place to work. We have a lot to look forward to in 2025 and beyond.
