Family reflects on stolen wages

You'll recall that last year, our hospital became the first Metro North facility to formally acknowledge that wages stolen from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were used to construct Redcliffe Hospital.

Following that event in 2024, the Beckett family made contact with us. Their grandmothers, the late Aunties Gloria and Kathleen Beckett had wages taken from them to build the hospital. The Beckett family have marched since 1944 as part of their fight for recognition and repatriation of these wages.

Earlier this month, the family visited the hospital and shared the impact these events have had on their family through the generations. While here, despite past hurts, the family also generously shared stories about the great care they have received at Redcliffe Hospital.

Unfortunately, I was unwell on the day the family visited however they meet with Metro North Chief Executive, Jackie Hanson, Cultural Capability Office, Elwyn Henaway, Indigenous Nurse Navigator, Leicha Wone-Grant and other hospital leaders, who showed them the plaque recognising the stolen wages.

Meetings and discussions like these are important part of helping achieve health equity, as we work to build trust with local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to enable better health outcomes for the community.



Cultural Capability Training

Another part of our drive toward health equity is ensuring that all members of our hospital community understand and can meet the unique needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
