

# Dear Colleagues,

It has been a busy week, especially with the humidity and temperature issues on Level 2 on Wednesday. I would like to thank everyone for working through the numerous issues, including postponing and rescheduling surgeries and dealing with affected drugs and consumables in the stock room. Thank you to all those staff who liaised with the impacted patients, many of whom would have been expecting to have their surgery before Christmas, and for those staff who worked extra hours.

## Tier 1 ARI

On Tuesday, Metro North moved to a Tier 1 from Tier 0 on the Acute Respiratory Illnesses response plan, due to the recent increase in community transmission of COVID-19.

To keep yourself, your family and patients safe, please

- Continue wearing masks in clinical areas in line with PPE guidelines.
- Ensure your flu/COVID vaccinations and fit testing are up to date. If you require vaccinating contact the Infection Management and Prevention Service (IMPS).
- Stay home if you are feeling unwell, notify your line manager, and submit your leave request promptly via the Smart Leave form on MyHR.
- If you test positive to COVID please let us know as soon as possible via the <u>online form</u> and <u>when</u> <u>you return to work</u>.
- If you are identified as a close contact, don a surgical mask at work for 5 days, complete a RAT test every second day for 5 days, and do not attend work if symptomatic, even if negative on a RAT test.
- Encourage visitors to wear a surgical mask, perform good hand hygiene and refrain from visiting if they are unwell.
- Include a Teams link as an option for all meetings.

### Summer weather

We have been experiencing some very wet weather already this summer and predictions are for above average rainfall and warmer than average temperatures. The catchments in the southeast are saturated and so even a moderate amount of rainfall could result in flash flooding.

To keep up to date with weather warning notifications please download the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) alerts app on your phone and turn on the notifications for weather events in our region.
