Less than two weeks until instructor-led training starts


The countdown is on, with ieMR instructor-led training commencing for most staff in less than two weeks, from Monday 3 February 2025.

Prior to attending instructor-led training session/s, nursing, midwifery, pharmacy, and some administration staff must complete mandatory online prerequisite training. This training can be completed at your own pace via <u>Talent Management System (TMS)</u>, but must be finalised before instructor-led training begins.

As of today, 20 percent of CKW staff have completed all of their ieMR training and proficiency, with the breakdown by staffing cohort below.

PeMR going live at Woodford Correctional Centre on Thursday, 5 June 2025

Alongside the integrated electronic Medical Record (ieMR) go-live at Caboolture and Kilcoy Hospitals occurring from 7 May 2025, the Prisoner electronic Medical Record (PeMR) will be going live at Woodford Correctional Centre on Thursday, 5 June 2025.

The PeMR can be thought of as an extension of the ieMR. Where the ieMR replaces paper-based records and workflows within a hospital, the state-wide PeMR system replaces paper-based

medical records and workflows used within Correctional Centre Health Services.

While technically separate projects, the sequenced implementations of the ieMR and PeMR across CKW will ensure our services all transition to using a digital medical record system together, and will enable safer transfer of care between our hospitals and Woodford Correctional Centre.
