Car parking update

The new multi-storey car park (P2) is nearing completion with an expected opening early March, with car park technology installation completed by end of April. As we near the technology install date, the car park team will begin to take applications for staff parking within the new multi-storey. TPCH staff parking QHEPS page will be updated with application forms available sometime in March.

This week, access changes to the existing car park have been implemented as the new express ramp between the two car parks begins to be used. Entry to the existing P1 car park will be via the new ramp which has been built to connect both car parks.

The illuminated data sign has been relocated further along Main Road to provide information to people visiting the campus about access changes to the car park. Temporary signage will be in place to direct vehicles, and directional signage to the temporary car park office (located adjacent to the entry and exit boom gates on the express ramp) will be installed throughout the car park and on the entry and exit boom gates.

The existing multistorey car park (P1) is the only car park on the campus for patients and visitors. Staff should plan to use the dedicated staff car parks.

Kallangur Satellite Hospital (Kalangoor) accreditation

I'm pleased to share the news that the Kallangur Satellite Hospital (now Satellite Health Centre) has been recommended for Australian Council on Healthcare Standards (ACHS) accreditation. This is a fantastic outcome and a very proud moment for everyone who works at the centre.

The centre underwent accreditation yesterday, one year following its opening. It welcomed two assessors from the ACHS who spent time interacting with staff, patients and consumers to observe and evaluate how services are delivered and comply with the national standards. The assessment concluded in the afternoon with a feedback session by the assessors which was overwhelmingly positive, with the centre receiving only two met with recommendations.

The assessors' feedback highlighted Kallangur's great staff culture and good processes. They said that the centre had a great community feel and that consumers felt safe going there.

Thank you to everyone who supported the ACHS assessors, helping them to get to know the centre, and the way its provides the community with safe and quality care. Well done! We will expect a full report with the assessment findings in the next four weeks.

Name change

After a consultation process with clinicians and a survey, a new name for satellite hospitals has been chosen. As of yesterday, Satellite Hospitals are now called Satellite Health Centres. The centres will continue to deliver the same trusted care including minor injury and illness care and outpatient services from dedicated nurses, medical officers, and allied health professionals.

Anyone in the community needing healthcare can access the satellite health centres, with minor injury and illness clinic offering a drop-in model similar to the emergency department while outpatient services are facilitated via referral pathways.
