Patient Safety Net

The new Patient Safety Net (PSN) program is launching in Metro North Health on 31 March 2025. This program provides an escalation process designed to strengthen the way we address patient safety concerns and empower all staff to raise their concerns.

PSN provides an easy, confidential way for staff to raise patient safety concerns that they





feel have not been addressed through the standard reporting processes.

It is available to all staff at Metro North including contractors, agency staff, students and volunteers, and can be accessed via <u>phone, email, or online</u>.

As part of our ongoing commitment to the safety and wellbeing of our patients I encourage all staff to familiarise themselves with how Patient Safety Networks, how to raise a concern, and when to take action.
