

Metro North's target this year is 85 per cent of staff having a flu vaccination. It's an ambitious goal but one we can reach when we work together.



All of us can also slow the spread of flu by follow some healthy habits, such as regularly washing our hands and cleaning surfaces, always covering coughs and staying home when unwell.

Free staff flu vaccinations will be available at COH from 14 April to 23 May.

And, it was a great success. Twelve rehabilitation registrars from across multiple Hospital and Health Services participated and our COH Senior Medical Officers were their examiners.


After the formal exam, there was a feedback session for all 12 Registrars, who were very thankful and impressed to learn from our COH SMO in our beach side facility!
