We've made it! Today is the first day of our integrated electronic Medical Record (ieMR) go-live, with the first of our services at Caboolture Hospital switching over to documenting in the digital patient record.

Floorwalkers wearing blue vests in can be easily identified and contacted for support when needed, with the Digital Command Centre also available to escalate issues to via: 1800 921 342. Please speak to your line manager if you are unsure who the floorwalkers are in your clinical area.

With the sequenced go-live of different clinical areas across the coming weeks ([please click here to view the go-live sequence](#)), temporary hybrid workflows will be in place until all areas of the hospital have gone live with the ieMR. Further, it is essential that you do not attempt to document in the digital patient record until your area has gone live – please ensure you have reviewed the [go-live sequence](#) and are aware of when the ieMR will be rolled out to your clinical area.

ieMR Program staff will be stationed in the foyer between the Clinical Services Building and Main Building each day this week until Friday, 8.00am to 4.00pm, to assist in setting up your ieMR favourites/views and Rapid Access Workstation Service (RAWS) swipe-card access.

Teams will also be roving across the hospital offering these same services, as well as handing out Aztec codes for nurses and midwives. An Aztec code is useful in enabling nurses' and midwives' new integrated vital signs workflow (manual data entry is otherwise required), with each staff member provisioned a unique Aztec code associated to their Novell ID.

Congratulations everyone for making it to this huge milestone in CKW's digital transformation journey! We look forward to providing you further updates on how our go-live progresses over the coming days and weeks.
