#### Metro North Strategic Plan

During the first half of 2025, we sought input and feedback from staff across the health service on the Metro North Strategic Plan 2024-28. This Plan is a roadmap to help guide the direction of our services and workforce so we can continue to provide responsive and sustainable health care to our community moving into the future.



We received an amazing amount of feedback from staff which has helped ensure that the Strategic Plan is relevant person-

centred and fit for purpose. Over recent weeks, the Plan has gone through various stages of development in conjunction with the Metro North Board. The final iteration of the Plan will go to the Board meeting for approval later this month, with the revised Plan set to go live from July 1. This represents an important milestone in the direction of Metro North as the Strategic Plan will act as the cornerstone for all decision making for the next four years.

Staff will have the opportunity to view, discuss and engage with the Chief Executive and Senior Executive Team members about the implementation of the updated Metro North Strategic Plan from 1 July. Specifically, we will hold a series of staff forums throughout July to discuss the plan and implementation.

#### Thank you for having your say

The Have Your Say (HYS) staff survey closed on Sunday. While we didn't reach our Metro North goal of 52% participation rate, we achieved 43%, which is proudly the highest number of staff we've seen participate in HYS to date with 10,815 surveys accessed. A sincere thank you to those who took time to share feedback.

BPA Analytics, the independent provider who facilitated the survey, is now collating the results. They will compile anonymous reports for each work unit which had 10 or more responses. We expect to relay the results to staff by early August.

#### Staff flu vaccination update

Metro North's staff flu vaccination program has had a strong start but there's more to do. So far this year, we have delivered more than 11,700 staff flu vaccinations. This is 49.1 per cent of our workforce, a solid foundation but still well below our 85 per cent target for 2025.



Influenza can spread rapidly in healthcare settings, putting vulnerable patients and staff at risk. More than 98 per cent of flu strains circulating this year are a good match for the vaccine, meaning it is likely to be effective. Across Queensland, about 23 per cent of people have had a flu vaccination. This is lower than the same time in 2024.

If you haven't already had a flu shot this year, make it a priority.

Staff vaccination clinics at our facilities are easy, quick and give protection to you and the people you care for. More details are on the <u>Staff Extranet</u>.

If you received your flu shot externally (e.g. GP or pharmacy), please remember to <u>register</u> so we can count it in our reporting.

#### Associate Professor Carol Douglas

Assoc Prof Carol Douglas was recently awarded a King's Birthday Honour Public Service Medal for her outstanding contributions to medicine and health care. Carol is a national leader in the field of palliative care, having directed the palliative care service at RBWH from 2005 to 2022, and at TPCH from 1998 to 2005. She was President of the Australia New Zealand Society of Palliative Medicine (ANZSPM) between 2015 - 2017 and currently serves as Medical Director of the Queensland Palliative Medicine Training Program (QPMTP).



Under Carol's leadership, the QPMTP was formally integrated into the state's medical

training system in 2013, leading to a steady increase in trainee numbers. The program now supports training across more than 20 sites and is helping shape the next generation of palliative care doctors. Her work has significantly improved access to high-quality end-of-life care across Queensland.

#### Associate Professor Joel Dulhunty

Assoc Prof Joel Dulhunty was named Emerging Philanthropist of the Year at the recent Queensland Gives Philanthropy Awards.

Joel, who is the Director of Research and Implementation at RBWH and Redcliffe Hospital, was instrumental in establishing the Raise it for Redcliffe, a fundraising initiative for patient care, staff wellbeing and research at Redcliffe Hospital which is now supported by RBWH Foundation. Since the initiative was established in 2020, he impressively raised over \$1 million in just four years. On Wednesday's



Giving Day this week, Joel rode from RBWH to Redcliffe Hospital on his iconic penny farthing, building on his previous epic cycles including a 500km penny farthing challenge and a 2,600km cycle from Cairns to Brisbane and a to raise funds for a senior nurse position.
