The Patient Safety Net program provides an escalation process designed to empower staff and strengthen the way we address patient safety concerns. It is available to all staff at Metro North including contractors, agency staff, students and volunteers, and can be accessed via <u>phone, email, or online</u>.

As part of our ongoing commitment to the safety and wellbeing of our patients I encourage all staff to familiarise themselves with how Patient Safety Net works, how to
