## Prostate cancer clinical trials underway

Last week marked a significant moment for our Medical Oncology and Nuclear Medicine teams as Australian-first Phase-2 clinical trials of a new treatment for patients with end-stage metastatic prostate cancer commenced.

The new therapy - *Actinium-225 PSMA* - treats prostate cancer cells by directly targeting the Prostate Specific Membrane Antigen (PSMA) to deliver a powerful blast of radiation to within a fraction of a millimetre of cells that have the receptor, while leaving healthy cells untouched.

The new treatment also has minimal side effects for patients compared with other therapies, allowing them to get back to their usual activities within a few days.

This innovative therapy provides patients with new hope to further improve life expectancy and quality of life outcomes. Well done to everyone involved in getting us to this point.



## Thanks for keeping us safe
