Message from the Executive Director, TPCH | new multi-storey car park opening | 10 July



Summary:

• New multi-storey car park opens Monday 14 July



Dear colleagues,

I am excited to share with you all that the new multi-storey car park will open from **5am on Monday 14 July**, bringing some parking relief to TPCH.

While the new 1,500-space car park will open, the express ramp (which will provide direct access to Level 3 and above) and the link bridges between the two car parks won't be open from day one, as installation of boom gates and parking technology is still being completed. Once this is installed, the express ramp will open.

As the new car park opens, the existing multi-storey car park will be required to be closed for up to four weeks to allow for line-marking, light replacements and lift refurbishment. Temporarily closing the existing car park to do these works, will also help reduce the number of vehicles using the shared entry/exit driveway and ease traffic on Main Road for the first few weeks of operations of the new car park.

The existing multi-storey car park and bridges are expected to open in early to mid-August once all works are completed.

I acknowledge that with the opening of the new car park, more vehicles will be using the hospital's main entrance off Rode Road. Access to TPCH is impacted by traffic on already congested roads and we are looking at short and long term solutions to assist with traffic flow.

While TPCH and Metro North are not responsible for roads outside the hospital campus, we continue to liaise with the Department of Health, Brisbane City Council, and the Department of Main Roads in relation to Rode Road, Hamilton Road and Webster Road. The car park team is continuing to process applications for staff parking for the new

multi-storey car park.

Also, a reminder that once the car parking technology upgrades to the at-grade car parks are completed (anticipated September), tariffs will apply site-wide.

We anticipate that there may be a few initial adjustments as staff and visitors become familiar with the workings of the new car park including access and exits and there will be staff on-hand to assist. I would like to remind everyone to please be patient and respectful.
