In memory - Patricia Greenwood

Pat Greenwood made a significant impact on the physiotherapy profession during her time as Physiotherapist in Charge at TPCH from 1974 to 1995.

As the hospital's original and sole senior physiotherapist, Pat established the

Physiotherapy Service at TPCH. Under her leadership, it grew into a vital part of patient care and laid the foundation for the service we know today. Pat graduated from the University of Queensland in 1951 and held senior roles at Chermside Chest Hospital from 1960 until her appointment as Physiotherapist in Charge at TPCH.

In recognition of her outstanding service to Queensland Health, Pat was awarded the Public Service Medal in 1994. Following her retirement, Pat continued to be remembered for her compassion and leadership. She passed away recently, leaving behind a legacy that continues to inspire our Physiotherapy Service.

I would like to thank Dr Alex Chaudhuri as he steps down as Director of Infectious Diseases.
