The first celebration on 4 August 1988, was chosen to communally celebrate the birthdays of children of the Stolen Generations. Historically, children who were removed from their families and communities, many of the children didn't know when they were born, were all given 4 August as their birth date.

The theme for 2025: *Little Footsteps Big Future* – celebrating our leaders of tomorrow and honouring our children's journey through culture and connections to country, community and family. Culture plays a vital role in our lives and being able to pass knowledge onto our jarjams (children) is also important in giving Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people strength and connection.

Sepsis Clinical Nurse Consultant - Celine Hill


CKW was the first hospital in Queensland to introduce a dedicated sepsis nursing role. Celine's passion for this role is in supporting sepsis education, auditing, policy development and clinical reviews. Celine also helps other health services create similar roles and is a goto resource for all things sepsis.

Mortality & Morbidity Officer - Cheryl Fourie

This role oversees all aspects of patient deaths at the hospital, from clinical reviews to coordination with coroners and families. It also supports quality improvement through mortality and morbidity meetings and audits. For Cheryl, being able to support a patient's end-of-life journey is an honour and the reason why she loves her job.

Patient Safety Officers - Stephanie Baker, Megan Mowbray, Melissa Petty

While their primary focus is on Severity Assessment Code (SAC 1) incidents, Patient Safety Officers (PSOs) also proactively identify potential risks to patient safety by analysing data and identifying themes linked to reported incidents. PSOs review adverse events and near misses to determine contributing factors and root causes, helping inform system improvements and prevent recurrence. A key skill for this job is building relationships with compassion and good communication, whilst balancing clinical competency.
