Safety & Quality Compliance Officer Policy and Procedure portfolio – Hannah Wilshire: Hannah supports the development, review, and governance of procedural documents, ensuring they meet legislative, accreditation, Metro North standards and works with stakeholders.

Safety & Quality Compliance Officer Risk and Compliance portfolio – Brenda Wallace: Brenda's role involves leading the organisation's risk management function, coordinating product recalls and alerts. She also supports compliance for audits, ensuring readiness for accreditation surveys.

Safety & Quality Data Manager - Shevaun Cardier:

Shevaun's focus is on developing solutions for the monitoring and compliance of Safety & Quality indicators, National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards and health service agreements and directives.



Mandatory training reminder

Continuing the safety theme, one of the ways we keep our hospital community safe is by completing mandatory training as it becomes due.

To support this, all staff are asked to complete the following modules for completion prior to commencing work on their next shift:

- General evacuation instructions
- First response evacuation instruction

Staff should also ensure they:

- Complete mandatory training: Ensure all required modules, including Fire Safety Training, are current in TMS.
- Seek support when needed: If you're unsure how to complete a task safely or are having trouble accessing training, reach out to your manager.
- Track your progress: Check TMS regularly to stay on top of your training deadlines.

When we all keep our training up to date, we are helping to create a safer workplace for everyone.

Staff meals and taxi vouchers

When staff work overtime, it is important that we ensure staff wellbeing and safety. In order to do this, those who are undertaking approved overtime may be eligible to access a meal through Food Services with approval from the Hospital Coordinator. Taxi vouchers are also available when appropriate.

Key points to note:

Eligibility: Staff can access one meal per approved overtime shift.

Options: There are currently five meal choices available. Meals will cater to a range of dietary requirements including vegetarian & vegan, halal, gluten free, and allergen free. Food Services will advise the current selection at the time of accessing.

To access food and taxi vouchers: The Hospital Coordinator can provide the taxi voucher and will confirm the meal with Food Services and advise of collection point.

- 3. Great place to work


We all have a key role in achieving each of these goals and it is important to think about our actions, our focus and what we bring to work each day to positively influence these.
