Among the areas visited included the Emergency Department and Transit Lounge, where we continue to do impressive work under high clinical demand.

As part of the board meeting, we were also pleased to welcome to Redcliffe the Acting Deputy Director-General of Health Infrastructure Queensland, Sam Sangster. During his time with us, it was clear that he supports an interim solution ahead of the delivery of the Redcliffe Hospital Expansion.

Thank you again to everyone who assisted with the board meeting, in particular our Planning and Performance team, and Clinical Council leadership.

Redcliffe Hospital Expansion update

The Redcliffe Hospital Expansion Project has been given a unique opportunity to reset the project, following the release of the Queensland Government's Hospital Rescue Plan (HRP).

Importantly, the HRP reaffirms that our expansion project is proceeding, and we are delivering at least 210 new overnight beds and expanded services, including maternity,

endoscopy, operating theatres and more car parks.

The HRP also confirms the Government's commitment to listening to clinicians and empowering local decision-making in the development of our health infrastructure.

The focus over the next few months will be for the newly established Redcliffe Executive User Group to work with Health Infrastructure Queensland (HIQ) to complete a new concept design and costings to be submitted by the end of this year. The outcome of this will determine the ultimate scope of this project and funding allocation. This confirmation will enable more detailed planning and consultation to occur.


Nominations are now open for the <u>August Star of the Month Award</u>, and I'm sure we'll receive another great range of nominations.

Staff profile: Chantal Fichera

This week's Staff Profile focusses on the Disability Specialist within the social work team, Chantal Fichera.

Chantal has been at Redcliffe since 2021, and in the role of Disability Specialist since it was established in 2023.

The Disability Specialist role provides advice, education and clinical support to clinicians, patients and their carers about equitable access to health care for people with a disability.

Chantal says the role is particularly important, with around one in five people in our local community living with a disability.



"People with disability often experience barriers to accessing healthcare. Sometimes it's because of discrimination, or it's exclusion from decision making. Other times, it's caused by lack of access or inadequate care, which contributes to poorer physical and mental health outcomes."

"My role is about promoting inclusion and removing those barriers," Chantal said.

"The role focuses on identifying inpatients with complex communication, behavioural and/or care needs, and ensuring they receive the adjustments required – from the point of admission, throughout their care and therapy, all the way to discharge planning."

"A core function of the role is also supporting the implementation of the Metro North Disability Services Action Plan, which we launched at Redcliffe Hospital in March last year."

The role operates Mon-Thurs from 8:30am-4:30pm with an outpatient clinic offering telehealth and telephone appointments on Monday 1pm-4:30pm. Inpatients can self-refer through the ward social worker. Other patients can refer through the Social Work Department or during an appointment with another hospital clinician.

Lastly this week, recognising how busy things are right now a reminder to please look after ourselves and each other. If you're unwell - please do not come to work - take the time you need to recover and avoid spreading illnesses to your colleagues or patients.
