Redcliffe Hospital Expansion update

As busy as we are clinically, we are pushing ahead with some big strategic bodies of work. The biggest and most important of these is the Redcliffe Hospital Expansion.

Last week, we shared the first Redcliffe Hospital Expansion Project Roadmap. This week, we kicked off the initial consultation phase that will run throughout September. This initial round of consultation involves a smaller group of staff, ahead of a much broader staff consultation and



engagement that will be necessary when we reach the design phase.

We'll arrange a Special Staff Forum soon to talk more about the Roadmap and the Expansion project.

Another of these big strategic bodies of work is our response to the Have Your Say Staff Survey. Last Friday, our Senior Leadership Team were briefed on the Redcliffe Hospital results. Yesterday morning, more than 60 staff and leaders attended a Special Staff Forum with Acting Chief Executive, Dr Liz Rushbrook where we shared the key findings of the Have Your Say survey at the Metro North level. Fraser, Joanne Yates, Gemma Van Fleet, Kellie Hansen, and Ali Moran.


The Operating Theatre team received the award for the way they work together across professions to care for patients and improve patient flow.
