Dear colleagues,

Since the launch of the new Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander anti-racism policy and *Stop Racism. It Starts with Me* campaign, we continue to grow momentum providing awareness and education across the organisation.

On Thursday 13 November 2025 from 12pm to 1pm I will be hosting a *Stop Racism. It Starts with Me* Vidcast in collaboration with Acting Chief People and Culture Officer, Brett Bourke.

I encourage all staff to join us on this Vidcast to find out more about the campaign, policy, reporting mechanisms and how each staff member of the organisation has a responsibility to create spaces free from racism and discrimination and where staff, community, patients and visitors feel safe to attend.

I am pleased to share that the Cultural Practice Program (face-to-face) and Identification Training (available both face-to-face and online) are now mandatory for all Metro North Health staff.

As of 1 September 2025, the updated <u>Mandatory Training policy</u> includes these essential programs, reaffirming our commitment to strengthening cultural capability across the organisation.

To support this rollout, the Talent Management System (TMS) has automatically assigned these courses to all staff from Monday, 15 September. New starters will have 90 days from their commencement date to complete the training. Existing staff are also required to complete this training; however, they have until the end of the current Health Equity Strategy timeframe (2025–2028) to do so.

This is a significant milestone and a proud achievement for Metro North Health. These programs are not just a requirement – they are a vital part of our journey toward creating a culturally safe and responsive health system for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

It is expected that all staff complete the training.

Staff can view upcoming training dates by searching the course name on TMS or contacting their local directorate <u>Cultural Capability Officer</u>.

Last month, I had the privilege of attending the UQ Poche Centre for Indigenous Health's 10-Year Anniversary celebration. It was a wonderful opportunity to reflect on a decade of collaboration and progress in Indigenous health research, and to hear inspiring stories from researchers, students and partners all working towards improving Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health outcomes.

Looking ahead, on 19 November we'll host our final Health Equity Showcase for the year – this time in an expo-style format. This new approach makes it easier for community members to drop in at a time that suits them, meet our health teams, and connect directly with services. I'm looking forward to seeing both staff and community come together to yarn, share, and take home valuable health information to support themselves and their families. 

By breaking down barriers and embedding


cultural safety at every step, they're creating stronger connections and better health outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.


New Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Services space opens at Caboolture Hospital!


Metro North Disability Resources for Staff
