#### Marie Dawe - Remembrance Day, Tuesday 11 November

11 November marks the anniversary of the Armistice in 1918 that ended World War I. Every year at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, millions around the world pause to remember the sacrifices many have made so we can enjoy life today.

This Remembrance Day, join us in honouring those who gave their lives in service, as Caboolture Hospital support officer and ex-service personnel, Marie Dawe, recites the Ode over the PA system, followed by the Last Post.

I thought it fitting that we should reflect on Marie's story today.

At a spritely 21, Marie saw an ad in the local paper and decided to join the Royal Australian Navy as a writer in the supply branch, where her tasks would range from clerical, pay



accounts, HR, personnel administration, and defence recruiting.

Not all Marie's tasks were based on land, and in 1994 she was part of the first female crew to board HMS Canberra, a war ship containing approximately 180 crew members which patrolled the coast of Australia and South-East Asia to protect our coastline.

"I made some amazing friends who taught me how to be a Leading Seamen at sea," Marie said.

"Even though I was in administration, I still had to go through basic training and learn how to fire an SLR rifle and a pistol.
