Important staff safety reminder

I would like to take this opportunity to remind staff to remain vigilant of their safety at all times. Always ensure you:

- Stay aware of your surroundings. Using headphones or speaking on your phone decreases your situational awareness.
- Walk to or from your parked car with a buddy.
- Avoid areas where you don't feel safe eg. Short-cuts through parks or areas of darkness.
- Walk in the opposite direction to traffic, and where possible.
- Be confident and assertive, and trust your instincts.
