

Staff Profile - Rachael Ramsay, Midwife Navigator

Midwife Navigator Rachael supports socially vulnerable pregnant women at Caboolture Hospital and has supported over 1,200 women since her role began in 2019.

When women at the antenatal clinic identify as having vulnerabilities, challenges or complex social circumstances, Rachael can connect them with essential services, including mental health services, social work and community organisations.

"I meet women wherever they feel most comfortable, whether that's in the antenatal clinic, at their home, or even just meeting for a coffee first," Rachael shares.

"It's about getting the most support to women during that short period, when they are often more open to engaging with services that can help them long-term."

I was saddened to learn this week that respected Turrbal Elder, Maroochy Barambah, has passed away after a courageous cancer battle.

Maroochy performed Welcome to Country at many Metro North events and was an acclaimed songwoman who took her culture to stages in Australia and across the world. Notably, she performed at the United Nations in New York during the International Year for the World's Indigenous Peoples and for world leaders at the G20 in Brisbane in 2014.

Maroochy is survived by her daughters, Baringa and Kulkarawa, and her grandson, Dalapai, and leaves a lasting legacy of advocacy for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People.
