Roze's aspiration journey

Six-year-old Roze was born at Caboolture Hospital and was experiencing ongoing respiratory and feeding difficulties, enduring years of illness, fatigue and repeated infections.

Following investigations, clinicians found a deep interarytenoid groove, (also known as a minor laryngeal cleft,) that caused Roze to aspirate fluids into her airway.

Roze and her mum Emma are now contributing to a study at Caboolture Hospital where the team, led by Adj Assoc Prof Thuy Frakking, is developing a digital app to diagnose

swallowing impairment.

Life-changing care closer to home

Cancer patients who've previously had to travel for their treatment can now be treated nearer to home, thanks to the newly opened Day Chemotherapy Unit at Caboolture Hospital.

One of those patients to benefit is Andrew, who had previously been driving to and from North Lakes for treatments before the new Caboolture Hospital unit opened late last year.



"Being five minutes away means my wife can drop me off and pick me up after treatment and I am home quickly," Andrew says, attesting to the positive difference the unit has made.

"My cancer diagnosis has changed what is important in life.

"It's spending as much quality time with my wife, daughter and stepson, not wasting my energy on things that aren't important and living my life as normally as I can."

Senior Health Workers - Ngarrama Maternal Health

Ngarrama is a free antenatal and birthing service for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families who choose to give birth at Caboolture or Kilcoy Hospitals.

The service is available to:

- Any woman who identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, and
- Any woman whose baby is Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.

Caboolture Hospital has two Ngarrama Senior Health Worker positions. These Senior Health Workers provide support across Caboolture Hospital and the Bribie Island Satellite Health Centre.

Ngarrama Senior Health Workers are part of a broader multidisciplinary team working collaboratively across Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, Caboolture, Kilcoy and Redcliffe Hospitals to support culturally safe maternity care.

Thank you to the Ngarrama Maternal Health team for providing such integral care to the community.


