For many, plastic surgery brings to mind movie stars and facelifts, but for patients of the RBWH Reconstructive and Plastic Surgery Centre, it's about rebuilding their lives.

Director of the Service, Dr Cameron Mackay explains what the team does.

Our caseload includes traumatic injuries, cancer-related treatment and chronic wounds," Cameron said.
