The Pelvic Health Physiotherapy Screening Clinic (PHPSC) was established to relieve pressure from specialist waitlists and Advanced Physiotherapist Katie, who works in the clinic, is seeing the everyday difference for urology and gynaecology patients.

"There's a growing awareness of the benefits of physiotherapy in pelvic health, as opposed to other interventions, and an understanding that surgeries aren't always first-line care anymore," Katie said.

"Now, with our gynaecology and urology screening clinics, these patients see a physiotherapist first, while they are on the waiting list for a specialist.

Lastly this week, a reminder that we'll be kicking off our staff flu vaccination campaign next Monday with a day-long clinic in the Education Centre, starting at 8am.

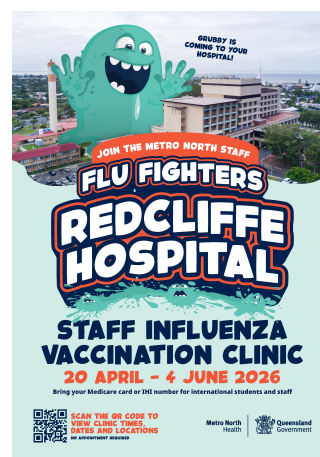
Receiving your free flu vaccination is one of the simplest and easiest ways to protect yourself, your family and each other this winter.
