The Bombs, Blasts and Bullets (B3) course has been developed and successfully conducted in Western Australia for a number of years. The Health Disaster Management Unit, has brought the course founder, Dr Andy Roberston, to Queensland to facilitate this course as part of preparations for the Commonwealth Games.

- The course is aimed at providing participants with the base knowledge and skills to respond effectively to events involving these types of injuries. The course specifically reviews the risk, threat and specific vulnerability to such an emergency, as well as the clinical management of casualties with injuries relating to these events in both pre- hospital and hospital settings.
- 80 delegates maximum targeted towards middle level management, medical and senior staff and other roles specific to pre-hospital and hospital response to disasters.
