COVID-19 daily update for Thursday 10th February 2022

As Metro North is now on <u>Tier 3</u>, there have been some questions about what this means for us at CKW.

The table below clarifies key points regarding training, PPE, meetings, outpatients and procedures:

Training	Essential training delivered virtually.	Essential training = related to patient safety and clinical care.

		<u>Patient care (COVID-19 suspect or</u> <u>confirmed)</u> = P2/N95 mask, Protective eyewear (in addition to spectacles), Gown/Apron, Gloves.
		Staff in non-clinical buildings (incl Riverside) = Surgical mask unless working alone in their own office.
		<u>Staff outside on hospital site (eg walking to</u> <u>car or another building)</u> = surgical mask.
		Inpatients (age 12+) = Surgical mask where tolerated, unless in own bed.
		<u>Outpatients</u> = Surgical masks in waiting rooms.
		<u>Visitors</u> = Surgical masks.
Meetings	Virtual meetings only.	All meetings = online.
	Suspension of non-essential meetings.	Essential = related to safety or operational requirements.
Outpatients and Procedures	Metro North Health Tier 3 Plan	Slow return to increased activity, specific to clinical team, as determined by Exec and updated in daily IMT.



- Caboolture Hospital has 13 COVID-19 inpatients.
- Woodford Corrections Health has 23 COVID-19 positive patients. Kilcoy Hospital has one COVID-19 positive patient.
- Metro North has 411 positive patients. This includes 91 patients in hospital, seven in ICU and five ventilated. There are 320 patients in the virtual ward.
- Metro North has 203 positive staff and 196 staff in quarantine (related to a close contact).
- Metro North Health is committed to prioritising fit testing for all frontline staff. Check the <u>Fit Testing</u> <u>Extranet page</u> for CKW dates and phone 5316 2422 to make an appointment.
- Regular Booster clinic is open at Caboolture Hospital Library every Wednesday. We will be reviewing this at the end of February as there has been low attendance the past few weeks.
- Once you have had a booster, please upload the vaccination certificate on the COVID-19 Extranet
 page (not TMS). Find the blue '<u>Register Your Evidence</u>' button in the middle of the page. Note this
 page is internal access only (but don't use Internet Explorer).
- A staff COVID-19 Testing clinic is operational in the Caboolture Hospital Staff Car Park. Operational from 7.30am 3.30pm every day with PCR and RAT testing. RAT kits also available after hours from EOC (phone 5316 5014), hospital coordinators or ED triage if all other options not available.
- At CKW, a plan is being developed to resume planned care and ability to continue BAU processes. This will be a gradual, staged approach.
- Working from home arrangements, where safe and productive, continue until Sunday 13 February. There is then an expectation from Metro North for all to return to the workplace.
- All Metro North Health Staff returning from overseas in the last 14 days are required to apply for an exemption before returning to work. Please make sure you tick the 'General Exemption from a Health Direction' box. Several applications have been declined recently due to do staff incorrectly ticking the 'Specialist/Essential Worker' box. There is an update coming later this week that will make this process more straightforward.
- Changes to the Healthcare Worker Framework will allow for the return of asymptomatic close contact workers utilising a risk matrix process to guide suitability. At present, this discussion is to involve line manager and EOC with a flowchart process pending.
- Notify EOC of redeployable staff call Ext 5014 or email EOC-CabKilcoy@health.qld.gov.au
- Vaccinated visitors allowed as per the <u>Hospital Entry Direction (No.11)</u> effective from Saturday (5/2). A revised Hospital Visitors Directive is expected in coming days.
- The requirement to use the Check-In Queensland app has been removed for locations not covered under the vaccine mandate. That means no more checking in at the supermarket, but it's still required at pubs, clubs, restaurants, cafes and visiting a hospital.
- Breaks and use of tearooms staff are encouraged to eat outdoors; please ensure you are socially distanced, minimise mask off time and wipe down hard surfaces when finished.

If you are displaying any symptoms of COVID-19, get tested and immediately **isolate.**
