Site snapshot

Demolition of the former Children's Hospital has now begun.

The demolition will be a controlled process and has started with the removal of all non-structural building materials. Noise, vibration and dust will be closely monitored throughout the demolition.

Heavy machinery is on site for the demolition work and truck movements along Herston Road will increase as materials are moved to and from the site. Pedestrian access will be maintained along Herston Road and traffic control operators are available as needed.

We're continuing to work closely with the local community and staff on the Herston site.





A legacy for patients of the former Children's Hospital

Metro North Hospital and Health Services (MNHHS) recognises that families and former staff across Queensland have an emotional connection and enduring bond with the former Children's Hospital.

MNHHS and Children's Health Queensland are working together to ensure that the legacy of this former hospital site is respected and its significance acknowledged by developing a memorial to honour the children who passed away at the Children's Hospital during its 135-year history.

What will replace the former Children's Hospital?

A purpose built, 132 bed specialist public health facility will be built on the site of the former Children's Hospital.

The new facility will comprise 100 rehabilitation beds, specialist rehabilitation support areas, a surgical and endoscopic centre with 32-bed surgical inpatient unit. seven operating theatres, three endoscopy rooms and recovery spaces.

Building the public health facility is a priority for the Herston Quarter Redevelopment and it will be the first building to be constructed as part of the project. Construction will commence in early 2018, once the demolition of the former Children's Hospital has been completed. This building is scheduled for completion in 2020.
