Common challenges in primary care: Persistent pain management Thursday 23 May 2019

As part of our GP education series *Common challenges in primary care*, Metro North Hospital and Health Service (MNHHS) and Brisbane North PHN invite GPs to spend an informative evening with a panel of experts from The Professor Tess Cramond Multidisciplinary Pain Centre.

There will be case based presentations, discussions and an opportunity to network with clinicians and colleagues, as well as a Q & A session.

Topics to be covered will be information about the local pain management services, modern biopsychosocial approaches to pain illustrated by cases and challenges around opioid prescribing. Many members of the multidisciplinary pain management team will be present to network and provide answers to any questions during the evening.

Learning outcomes will include:

- 1. Outlining the opportunities and challenges associated with making a persistent pain management referral.
- 2. Outlining and developing a detailed biopsychosocial persistent pain assessment
- 3. Developing a preliminary assessment and management plan for non-specific low back pain in primary care with attention to red flags
- 4. Developing a preliminary assessment and management plan for chronic widespread body pain (such as fibromyalgia) in primary care
