Touching bats puts people, pets and bats at risk



- If you find your pet interacting with a bat, protect them both by removing your pet from the area.
- If you have concerns about your pet, seek advice from your local veterinarian.



- If a bat is injured or trapped, never try to catch them or touch them.
- Report any injured or trapped bats to RSPCA.



- A bite or scratch from a bat can be deadly.
- Protect yourself and your family by not touching bats.
- Seek medical attention immediately for any bites or scratches.

Protect your family, your pets and injured bats.

Report injured bats to RSPCA at 1300 ANIMAL

Children and bats don't mix A bite or scratch from a bat can be deadly.



If a child is interacting with a bat, remove the child and avoid further contact. Seek medical attention immediately for any bites or scratches.

Report any injured or trapped bat to RSPCA at 1300 ANIMAL. Never attempt to touch or catch a bat.
