We are delighted to present to all Herston partners, the 2020 Herston Health Precinct Symposium. This year we are expanding, bringing together more Precinct partners. We welcome CSIRO and the various Institutes on Herston campus to our Precinct "family".

In view of the great success of last year's Herston Complex State of the Art Healthcare Symposium we are using a similar formula with the same template we used in 2019. The Keynote Lectures starting at 11am again have a broad based appeal – the value of International collaborations, the future changes in the way we practice medicine in its broadest term, artificial intelligence and augmented reality.

Our 2020 Symposium will be bigger than ever before, already attracting almost 300 abstracts. For presenters this year there will also be more oral free paper sessions than last year. The program has been designed to have something for everyone: state of the art multidisciplinary sessions in the afternoons as last year, concurrent education and research sessions for staff in training, more oral scientific research presentations, as well as extra morning sessions involving Indigenous Health, a multidisciplinary Military session and a Research Enablers session.
