

COVID Monoclonal Antibody (MAB) Community Clinic – General Practitioner information

The Monoclonal Antibody (MAB) Community Clinic is a day therapy infusion lounge providing treatment (such as Sotrovimab) for **confirmed (via PCR or RAT Testing) COVID-19 positive patients** in line with the Queensland Health guidelines such as [Sotrovimab prescribing guidelines](#). Patients who test positive via RAT, will need to be reconfirmed positive by a further RAT test by the infusion team prior to treatment.

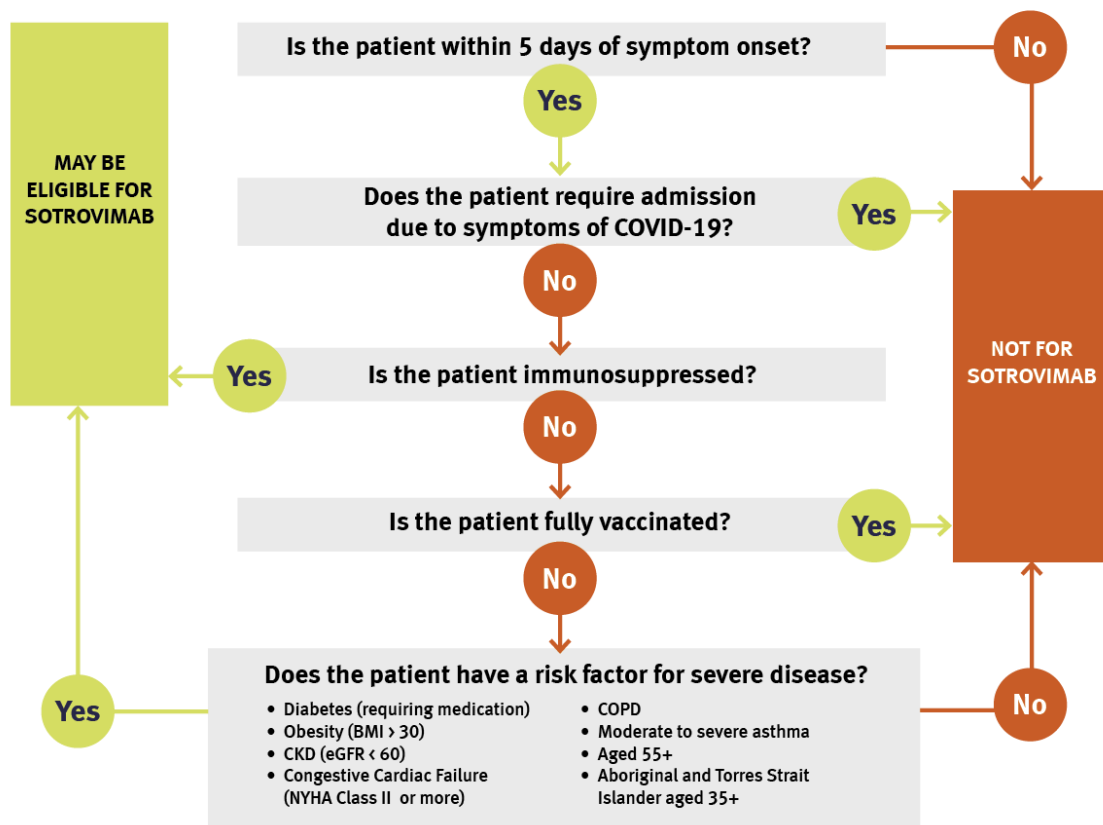
The Monoclonal Antibody (MAB) Community Clinic is located in North Lakes Health Precinct. Appointments will take between 90 and 150 minutes.

How to refer to the MAB clinic

This is a GP referral only clinic and eligibility for treatment may be dependent on supply and risk priority.

GP Referrals to the Monoclonal Antibody Community Clinic will only be accepted following discussion with the Metro North Virtual Emergency Department on 1300 847 833 (7 days a week 0800-1800) based on the decision pathway such as for Sotrovimab below:

After referral, patients will be assessed against current criteria, in line with a state-wide tiered access process. **If suitable, an appointment will be made.** For ongoing care after infusion, patients will be either referral back to their GP (low or moderate risk) or admitted to the Virtual Ward (high or very high risk).
