Women's and Newborn Services (WNS) provides comprehensive secondary, tertiary and quaternary care to the women, babies and families in our own community, and also to the people of Queensland.

Deanne August was the recipient of the Professor Joan Webster Nursing and Midwifery Research Award. The RBWH Neonatal group were finalists in the Complex Health challenges Research Award.

Together, our team supports 9 maternity clinical trials, 25 neonatal clinical trials, 10 gynaecology clinical trials and 7 Gynaecology Oncology clinical trials. Research teams in WNS were successful in being awarded 10 research grants in 2021. We currently have 35 research higher degree students within WNS with another 4 staff completing PhD's in 2021. Two of our midwifery research higher degree students – Emma Shipton and Lisa McKeon had their RBWH Foundation Scholarships renewed to continue to support their work.

We are delighted to see clinical staff from all disciplines in WNS undertake research that changes clinical practice.

We are proud to have two Metro North Clinical Research Fellows working on research within Women's and Newborn Services – A/Prof Victoria Eley, who is working towards reducing the use of perinatal antibiotics, with the hope this might reduce allergic disease in children; and A/Prof Susie de Jersey, who is working towards new screening approaches for gestational diabetes.

We are also delighted to have ongoing collaborations with colleagues in cardiology, infectious diseases, and mental health.

We are thrilled to welcome A/Prof Lauren Kearney to lead our midwifery research program and look forward to ongoing collaboration with the School of Nursing, Midwifery and Social Work at the University of Queensland.

We continue to value our collaborations with research groups in UQCCR – Prof Paul Colditz and the Perinatal Research Centre, Prof Hayden Homer and the Oocyte Biology Lab and Prof Andreas Obermair and the Queensland Centre for Gynaecological Cancer.

This year has been an exciting one for the RBWH Neonatal Research group! Not only has an enormous amount of high-quality research work been achieved, the highlights were certainly the awards and recognition of the hard work by the unit's dedicated clinician researchers. Obstetrics and Gynaecology

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology delivers excellent patient-centred care and high-quality tertiary and quaternary obstetrics and gynaecology services for MNHHS and QLD. The department is involved in multidisciplinary research to ensure the care of the women we treat and manage is contemporary and evidenced based. Collaborative research is the key – strengthening collaborations and partnerships in line with the strategic directions, and Metro North Health's Research Strategy 2017-2022 to encourage collaboration and excellence across the themes of diagnostics, therapeutics and health services.

Maternity Services collaborate closely with the Perinatal Research Centre, University of QLD and UQCCR for local state and commonwealth grants and multi-centre research projects. The department has been progressive in the enhancement of research activities in the area of antenatal care, general obstetrics and gynaecology.

The Obstetrics and Gynaecology department continues to collaborate with numerous other departments within Metro North Hospital and Health Service (MNHHS) as well as with UQ, QUT, UQCCR, Mater Hospital, interstate hospitals and New Zealand. A growing academic team in O&G along with O&G PhD scholars (Tanaka, Smith) and more registrars and residents undertaking and presenting research is increasing research output to enhance clinical outcomes.

Doctors Amoako and Tanaka have an ongoing research project into the genetics of endometriosis, and via the RBWH research foundation. In 2019, Metro North Health partnered with the University of Queensland to offer a collaborative research grant to Dr Amoako and the project team to enable new collaborative research between clinicians, academics and scientists with the potential to lead to ongoing research of direct benefit to Metro North Health patients and the community. Research funded through this program has formed the basis for ongoing collaboration between Metro North Health and the University of Queensland to identify the knowledge gap which currently exists in the diagnosis and treatment of endometriosis and the potential to bridge this gap to improve the lives of Australians living with this debilitating disease. This project aims to establish a scalable, high-quality, standardised clinical and surgical database populated with linked professionally processed and curated biospecimen repository to facilitate high-quality translational research, this data infrastructure will improve screening, diagnosis, prevention and management of patients at risk of or living with endometriosis. This will be achieved through establishing a secure database and collecting large scale clinical data and linked biospecimen to facilitate research collaboration to stimulate new ground-breaking research concepts, methods and technologies including advanced bioinformatics and computational biology such as deep machine learning and artificial intelligence to address the needs of Australians with endometriosis.

Dr Lehner is conduction research pertaining to COVID and peri mental health effects. The Gynaecology Oncology department continue their focus on conducting surgical clinical trials to develop the best standard of care for women experiencing gynaecological cancer and have been awarded 5 grants to undertake further clinical trials.

The Maternal Fetal Medicine unit has been very proactive in fostering an environment conducive to prospective and retrospective research and audits as well as partnering with centres in both Australia and New Zealand to develop collaborative research. Dr Duncombe has been awarded a RBWH foundation Project Grant to conduct research centred on indicators of early gestational Pre-eclampsia (pre- 16 weeks pregnant).

In 2021 key research outputs include grants, publications, presentations at national and international meetings. Overall, there are 12 trials currently underway with 3 trials anticipated to commence in 2022, added to this achievement, there have been 7 grants awarded including 4 RBWH Foundation Grants awarded and 1 NHMRC grant.

Obstetric Medicine

The department of Obstetric Medicine continues to undertake high level research into maternal and fetal outcomes during and after pregnancy. A particular focus of research in 2021 was the effect of COVID-19 on clinical care provision and the impact of this on health workers in Metro North. Research into outcomes in women with cardiac disease in pregnancy continues to be a focus of the department as well as the impact of maternal metabolism on obstetric outcomes. 2021 also saw the recruitment of multiple patients to the Pneumatters trial evaluating the effect of maternal immunisation on infants born to Indigenous women.

Perinatal Research Centre

The Perinatal Research Centre (PRC), directed by Professor Paul Colditz, is committed to improving health for mothers and babies through world class biomedical and clinical research. Our multidisciplinary research team, consisting of clinicians, scientists, allied health professionals and engineers, aims to discover and translate research advances into clinical practice and better health outcomes for mothers and babies. Research within the PRC covers several related areas including neonatal brain injury and neuroprotection led by Dr Tracey Bjorkman, fetal growth restriction led by Dr Julie Wixey, systems physiology led by Dr Yvonne Eiby and Dr Barbara Lingwood, signal processing led by Prof Boualem Boashash as well as clinical trials involving the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital.

2021 was a successful year for the Perinatal Research Centre. We were awarded a 2021 RBWH Research grant led by Dr Yvonne Eiby and Prof Paul Colditz to identify priority targets for effective blood volume management in preterm infants. Dr Yvonne Eiby continues with her 4-year 2020 NHMRC Ideas grant examining why preterm babies may have poor outcomes. Preterm babies often have poor heart function that is associated with adverse neurodevelopmental outcomes. Preterm babies may also be vulnerable to low blood volume due to leaky capillaries. This study is examining whether leaky capillaries result in a loss of blood following birth and subsequently poor neurodevelopmental outcomes for these babies.

Professor Paul Colditz continues to lead a \$1.65 million NHMRC grant over 5 years to predict neurodevelopmental disability in babies born very preterm. By identifying structural and functional brain connectivity features earlier and more accurately than currently possible in the preterm brain, this research will enable better prediction of longer-term motor and neurodevelopmental function. This will lay the groundwork for new interventions to prevent or effectively treat brain injury. NHMRC, Cerebral Palsy Alliance, and other external sources have been instrumental in our continuing work on fetal growth restriction (FGR) and hypoxic-ischemic encephalopathy (HIE) projects using placental stem cells as a treatment for brain injury. Data from our encouraging preliminary studies have been presented at multiple National and International conferences.

The RBWH NICU will contribute to a new multicentre Phase III randomised controlled trial funded by NHMRC to determine whether Erythropoietin treatment can prevent adverse outcomes in babies with HIE. Other ongoing clinical trials which utilise state-of-the-art methods and techniques include predicting motor outcomes in preterm babies using MRI, optimising adaptation of the cardiovascular system to extrauterine life in the very preterm baby and determining the effects of different feeding regimens on development in preterm babies.

Our ongoing funding is creating amazing results and media interest and we look forward to another year of high impact translational research. We would like to thank RBWH Foundation and so many members of the public for their generous support which is vital to improving outcomes for mothers and babies through research.

QCGC Research's mission is to research and develop the best standard of care for women experiencing gynaecological cancer. This includes finding causes for and preventing gynaecological cancer; and finding better treatment options to cure women affected by gynaecological cancer. We have a focus on conducting surgical clinical trials. In 2021 we commenced the ENDO3 Trial which is a multicentre randomised trial investigating Sentinel Node Biopsy in Endometrial Cancer. We also continued our study of exercise in ovarian cancer (ECHO) as well as commencing exercise studies in recurrent ovarian cancer (ECHO-R) and gynaecological cancer (ACUMEN).
