Margaret Anne Ryan (nee O'Brien) passed away at the Wesley Hospital on 6th June 2022 at the grand age of 90 after a long battle with cancer. Her husband, Timothy passed away shortly after. They had been married 69 years and are survived by their 4 children, 12 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren. Her daughter Catherine who resides in Houston, Texas, also trained at RBH graduating in 1980. Mrs Ryan trained at RBH from 1949-1953 and also worked at the old Diamantina hospital at a time when they were severely understaffed with incredible responsibilities at such young ages. She was one of a few nurses who became proficient at working with patients who were connected to what was termed "the iron lung". Mrs Ryan worked as the Charge Nurse on D Floor (Women's ward) in Lawson House for over 6 years and spoke fondly of her time there. She was also a Nursing Supervisor (Blockie) from the early 70's to 1981, being the first married "Block Sister". RIP. Our sympathies are extended to the family.
