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Metro North Mental Health

2022 was another successful year for Metro North Mental Health Research with 109 peer review publications, 58 presentations at various events, and over \$500,000.00 awarded in competitive grant funding. These achievements are the direct result of the dedication and commitment of Metro North Mental Health staff, including Alcohol and Drug Service. Their hard work during yet another stressful and high-pressure year allowed them to manage the ever-increasing demands and pressures on our mental health services whilst also producing high-quality research and quality improvement outcomes. Below we briefly describe just a few of the many highlights for the year:

In 2022 Metro North Mental Health hosted the inaugural Research Symposium at QIMR Berghofer Medical Research Institute. The Symposium celebrated mental health research conducted not only at the RBWH but across the Metro North Mental Health Services including the Prince Charles Hospital, Redcliffe Caboolture Hospital, Alcohol and Drug Services, Queensland Eating Disorder Service, and Forensic Mental Health Services. The event was well received by its 67 in-person attendees with more attending online. Plans are currently underway for the 2023 Symposium.

Recruitment also began for the development of a communication training program for mental health professionals that focuses on developing cultural sensitivity and capability that enhances the delivery of accessible and responsive services and improved health outcomes or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander consumers accessing Queensland health mental health services. Led by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander researchers from QIMR Metro North Mental Health is a site for the \$2.8 Million NHMRC grant which received funding in 2022. The first stage of this 4-year project is a series of focus groups with Metro North Mental Health Staff to share their experiences about communication with Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander patients which will inform the development of the training program.

The Alcohol and Drug Services Nurse-led Take Home Naloxone (THN) Training Project was another highlight for Metro North Mental Health. Take home naloxone involves self-administered kits that reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. This project saw all mental health nurses at the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, the Prince Charles Hospital, and Redcliffe Caboolture Hospital receive training to deliver the THN program to clients. The finding from the Metro North Pilot were presented in at local and national forums triggering the implementation of THN training in various HHS and NGOs and was recognised for Excellence in Innovation at the Metro North Mental Health Staff Excellence Awards.

2022 saw the successful completion of a national consultation with people with lived and living experience discussing the National Statement of Principles for Forensic Mental Health. These principles have not been updated or reviewed since their publication in 2006. The project team conducted an online survey and fifteen workshops to inform the recommendation made to the National Mental Health Commission. With funding support from the National Mental Health Commission, the project involved a partnership of Queensland Forensic Mental Health Service, Queensland Centre for Mental Health Research, University of Melbourne, Mental Health Matters 2 Inc., and Murdoch Children's Research Institute. This work was the first of its kind and we hope to see real world outcomes in future National Principles.
